

AGATE PASS BRIDGE

USES & AMENITIES:

Scenic views (Agate Pass), wildlife watching.



SITE DESCRIPTION:

The only bridge to Bainbridge Island. Its two-lanes span Agate Passage for just less than ¼ mile, connecting the Kitsap Peninsula and the Port Madison Suquamish Indian Reservation with Bainbridge Island. Enjoy dramatic views of Agate Passage from both sides of the bridge. Please be considerate of bicyclist when driving across the bridge.



BACKGROUND / HISTORICAL INFORMATION

Prior to Agate Pass Bridge (built in 1950), Island residents relied on the mosquito fleet for travel and transporting goods.

MAP & DIRECTIONS:

Refer to North Bainbridge Area map.

Following Hwy 305 north or south, the bridge is located at the north end of Bainbridge Island.
